14 AMENDMENT OF TARIFF OF CHARGES IN RESPECT OF MISCELLANEOUS TRAFFIC RELATED SERVICES: 2021/22

1 STRATEGIC THRUST

The City identified ten (10) Priority areas that the Integrated Development Plan (IDP), Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP) and budget aim to achieve. The applicable priorities for this report are:

Priority 6: Safer City

2 OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this report is to inform the council of the proposed tariffs for financial year 2021/2022 from 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022 for Johannesburg Metropolitan Police (JMPD) for the rendering of core business. The further objective is request a permission from the council to use draft tariffs to conduct public consultations on 2021/22 services delivery engagements.

3 SUMMARY

The above Tariffs and Charges levied by the JMPD were last reviewed by the Council on 30 June 2019.

In general, the proposed tariffs are based on equity, affordability and cost recovery. For ease of administration, most tariffs have been rounded up to the nearest R5. The rounding up to the nearest R5 results, in some instances, in relatively high percentage increases which are however not significant increases in rand value. The Special Events Costing tariffs are based on cost of manpower and vehicle hourly rates for the event.

A charge for verification of MPO qualifications/certificates will be applicable to all external clients with effect from 1 July 2021. Furthermore, an additional charge for fingerprints is included in the costs of peace officers' training.

General Conditions for reduced fees:

- (1) No discount will apply to all stadium events.
- (2) No discount for open road events above 3 km in the 2021/22 financial year; 2022/23 and 2023/24 financial year.
- (3) The above discounts do not apply to sponsored and corporate races which will be fully charged for.
- (4) No discount for all events that take place on Sundays and public holidays.
- (5) JMPD official events are exempted from payment

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- (6) All open road events for 3 km and less will be given a 100% discount but will be liable or charged for planning costs
- (7) All NGO's (Non-Government Organisation), NPO's (Non-Profitable Organisation) will be given 80% discount for service rendered.
- (8) All legal marches and gathering happening in the City of Johannesburg and approved by JMPD will be given 80% discount.

... The effect of the increases is set out in Annexure A attached hereto.

4 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The proposed increase is in line with the City of Johannesburg's guiding principles on the determination of tariffs in that tariffs should be equitable and affordable.

5 LEGAL AND CONSTITUTIONAL IMPLICATIONS

The City of Johannesburg is authorised in terms of Sections 11(3)(i) and 75A(1) and (2) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 2000, read with Section 24(2)(c)(ii) of the Local Government: Municipal Finance Management Act, 2003, to levy and amend tariffs of charges in respect of any function or service of the municipality. It should though be kept in mind that by virtue of Section 28 (6) of the Local Government: Municipal Finance Management Act, 2003 (Act 56 of 2003) once the new tariffs have been determined in respect of the 2018/19 Financial Year, it may not be further increased during that financial year, except when required in terms of a financial recovery plan as contemplated in the Act. For that reason it is essential to ensure that the proposed increases comply with the budgeted needs of the Council in respect of the 2019/20 Financial year.
